<b>Purpose of the job</b>	<p>This role sits within the Evidence Team and is critical to ensuring that the Children's Commissioner's Office (CCO) can understand trends and issues in children's lives.</p> <p>The Data Analyst will be in charge of strengthening and updating the CCO's vulnerability database, ensuring that it continues to provide the best possible view of childhood vulnerability in England. They will also use their initiative, technical skills and passion for numbers to analyse complex survey or administrative data obtained by the CCO in order to shed light on issues facing children. Finally, they will help ensure that the Evidence Team can respond quickly to requests for data and analysis, providing the Commissioner with the facts and figures she needs to deliver effective policy and public affairs messages.</p>
<b>Specific duties</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To maintain and strengthen the CCO vulnerability database, by updating existing measures and adding new local and national measures and provide policy-relevant reports and insight from this analysis.</li> <li>• To analyse complex survey/administrative data as well as other data held by the Office in order to provide policy-relevant insights, outputs and reports on the lives, experiences and outcomes of vulnerable children.</li> <li>• To help ensure, as part of the Evidence Team, that the Commissioner has the statistics and analysis she needs to deliver effective policy and public affairs messages.</li> <li>• To work collaboratively with wider colleagues, providing analytical support as appropriate across the organisation in order to deliver the CCO's Business Plan priorities. This may involve work on new data requests, using the Commissioner's statutory powers, in order to shed new light on the lives, experiences and outcomes of vulnerable children.</li> <li>• To respond quickly to requests from colleagues across the CCO for analysis of new or existing data and statistics in relation to vulnerable children.</li> </ul>
